



Why Have Architectural Standards?

These guidelines are the next step in implementing the vision that began with Council's adoption of the Comprehensive and Strategic Plan in February 2020.

- 1. They assist developers in creating an active, vibrant, and safe community.
- 2. They seek to harmonize the design of the built environment by complementing the existing architecture.
- 3. They help create well-planned communities that integrate comfortable walking paths, gathering places, access to transportation and stimulate economic growth.





Types of Design Standards

These guidelines can be developed in different ways to best cater to their community. These are some options:


Conventional Zoning

Density use, FAR (floor area ratio), setbacks, parking requirements, maximum building heights specified




Zoning Design Guidelines

Conventional zoning requirements, plus frequency of openings and surface articulation specified



Form-Based Codes

Street and building types (or mix of types), build-to lines, number of floors, and percentage of built site frontage specified.




